Sarah (_____) - Do you think it will come true? Do you really think that I will be able to have a son?

Abraham (_____) - I only know what they just told us. It did not seem to matter that you are almost 90 years old and I am almost 100 years old.

Sarah (_____) - A son--at our age--truly a promise from God!

Sarah (_____) - I don't know about the time of the Messiah. I do know, though, that I will wait for God this time.

Abraham (_____) - Visited by messengers from God--What a blessing!

Abraham (_____) - Eliezer, I have a special job for you.

Eliezer (_____) - I will do anything for you, Abraham.

Abraham (_____) - It will be a very long journey. (Pause) I need to you go back to the land of my father and find a wife for Isaac.

Eliezer (_____) - Find a wife for Isaac?

Abraham (_____) - Yes, it is time for him to marry, and I want him to marry a woman who knows and loves the Creator God.

Eliezer (_____) - There will be many women to choose from. How will I know when I have found the right woman?

Abraham (_____) - God will go before you and will lead you to the family of my father. He will show you the way, and He will show you the right woman for Isaac. Let's pray about it now, and I will be praying until you return.



Tone Chimes - Sweet Hour of Prayer

Scene Four

Eliezer (_____) - I will wait here by the well to see if anyone comes and offers me a drink. I asked God to send a woman who would offer me a drink and offer to draw water for my 10 camels. It seems like a lot, but I think it will be a good test.

Companion - (_____) - That is a lot of water. Do you think God will answer your request?

Eliezer (_____) - Yes, I do. Nothing is too hard for God.

Rebekah enters carrying a water jug.

Eliezer (_____) - Excuse me, could I trouble you for a drink of water for myself and my traveling companion?

Rebekah (_____) - Of course you may have a drink. Your camels look thirsty, too. Would you like for me to draw water for them, too?

Eliezer (_____) - Yes, that would be very kind of you. Thank you.

Companion (_____) - Thank you for the water.

Eliezer (_____) - We have traveled for many days. (Pause) Who is your father? And is there room at your father's house for us to stay the night?

Rebekah (_____) - My father is Bethuel, son of Nahor and Milcah; and yes, there is lots of room at our home for you and your animals. You are most welcome.

Eliezer (_____) (to Traveling Companion) - What an answer to prayer! God has led me directly to my master's family.

Rebekah (_____) - Excuse me? Your master's family?

Eliezer (_____) - We don't have time for all of the answers now. Let's continue this discussion at your father's home.

Eliezer and Rebekah leave.

*Bethuel enters and sits by the fire.
Eliezer and Traveling Companion enter.*

Bethuel (_____) - Welcome to our home. I understand you have traveled many days. Please stay with us for as long as you need to rest.

Eliezer (_____) - Thank you for your kindness. I am on a special assignment for my master Abraham. I am here to find a wife for his son, Isaac.

Bethuel (_____) - A wife for his son?

Eliezer (_____) - Yes. I asked God to send me a sign. I asked that the right woman would give me a drink of water and would also offer to draw water for my traveling companion and my ten camels.

Bethuel (_____) - Wow--that is a lot of water!

Eliezer (_____) - Yes, and your daughter Rebekah was kind enough to do that for me. I know it is an answer to my prayer. Would you give permission for her to travel with me back to Canaan to Abraham's house and to be the wife of Isaac?

Bethuel (_____) - That is a very long way to move. I will ask her if she is willing to move so very far away from her family.

Rebekah enters.

Bethuel (_____) - Rebekah, you have heard what Eliezer is asking. Are you willing to go with this man to be Isaac's wife?

Rebekah (_____) - Yes, I will go. I know that wherever God leads me, He will take care of me.

Moses (_____) - I will go and know that you go with me.

Rahab (_____) - Where are who?

Searcher 1 (_____) - The men who just came in here.

Searcher 2 (_____) - We saw them come here.

Rahab (_____) - Oh, those men. They left out the other door and went out the gate. If you hurry, you can catch them.

Rahab (_____) **to spies** - I know you are from across the Jordan River and that your God is a powerful God. We have heard how He dried up the Red Sea and what you did to the two kings of the Amorites.

Spy 1 (_____) - Then why didn't you turn us over to those men?

Rahab (_____) - I also know that you will capture our city. Because I have saved your lives, when your armies capture our city, will you save my family and me?

Spy 1 (_____) - Our lives for your lives. God will bless you in a special way.

Spy 2 (_____) - You will need to mark your house. When you see our armies approaching, gather your family all together into your house, put this scarlet cord in the window, and we promise that all in your house will be safe.

Rahab (_____) - Thank you. Now go quickly--this way. Stay in the hills for three days; then go back to your camp. You will be safe by then. May your God go with you.
